

Validation and Motivation for non-formal and informal learning in Prison

Implementation Process - Assessment Interview Guide (Teachers/trainers and stakeholders)

Objectives

In each case, the interview will have the following objectives:

- **1.** To determine the perceived purpose of the informal learning activity from each respondent's perspective.
- **2.** To assess the extent to which the informal learning activity, as piloted in prison, meets expectations (from teachers, stakeholders and prisoners' perspectives).
- **3.** To identify key success factors relating to the implementation of informal learning activities in prison settings.
- **4.** To identify perceived barriers and/or other factors that might have a negative impact in similar initiatives in the future.
