Mr. Osama Amin studied German language at the Cairo University before he came to Germany. In Germany he enrolled at the Friedrich-Wilhelm-University in Bonn for German Language and Literature as well as Islamic Studies. After graduating he has been teaching German in various institutions for the Arabic community and Arabic in various institutions for the German community. Simultaneous he worked as a translator for German and Arabic.

Mr. Amin writes about developments in Germany and Europe that are interesting for the Arabic world in diverse Arabic Media, especially on educational topics. In Germany he has worked as a translator and as a journalist for several big players like Deutsche Welle, German Press Agency and political non-profit foundations.

Mr. Zaschel is an educationalist and Germanist. Since 2007 he is the head of division for prisoner's education in the Ministry of Justice Rhineland-Palatinate. He has participated in several European projects on prison education and recently is a member of a working group of EUROPRIS on prisoner's education.
